INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCES

Our readers might be interested in information about three international meetings scheduled for later this year. South African scholars will participate in these meetings and we hope to have a report of their impressions in due course. The three are:

1 THE COLLOQUIUM BIBLICUM LOVANIENSE

A conference sponsored by the Catholic University of Louvain and which traditionally precedes the annual meeting of the SNTS. The theme this year is the sayings of Jesus in early Christian tradition and the conference is scheduled for August 19-21, 1981 under the chairmanship of Prof Dr J Delobel. From the preliminary program it is clear that Q will once again be at the centre of the discussion and in addition a number of interesting short papers will be read.

2 THE GENERAL MEETING OF THE STUDIORUM NOVI TESTAMENTI SOCIETAS IN ROME, AUGUST 24 - 27, 1981

The Rome-meeting of the prestigious SNTS will focus on aspects of early Christianity and on hermeneutics. Main papers will be delivered in plenary sessions by Professors C K Barret, E Jüngel, U Wilckens, B Corsani and R Penna. A number of short papers will be read and the customary seminar groups will meet to pursue specialized subjects. Special attention will be given to hermeneutics and an additional seminar group has been formed for this purpose.

3 THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE SOCIETY OF BIBLICAL LITERATURE IN SAN FRANCISCO, DECEMBER 18-22, 1981

The first meeting of the second century of the SBL will take place on the West Coast. For details of SBL-activities, please consult the previous article.
