Die fokus val in hierdie uitgawe volledig op die Nuwe Testament.

Andries van Aarde bespreek die verhouding tussen 'resonansie' en 'konteks' in 'n poging om die beperkinge van 'n strukturalistiese benadering te deurbreek. Johannes Louw kyk opnuut na die verskil tussen Markus en Johannes se weergawe van die uur van Jesus se kruisiging, en argumenteer dat die teorie van twee verskillende stelsels van uurtelling nie die probleem oplos nie. Sam Fourie en Jacques Rousseau bied 'n indringende analise van die begrip 'eenheid' in Johannes 13-17 aan, en trek die praktiese konsekwensies daarvan vir Suid-Afrika deur. Pieter Craffert interpreteer Paulus se Damaskus-ervaring in die lig van Berger en Luckmann se model van bekering, en toon die implikasies daarvan vir die interpretasie van Galasiërs 1 en die kronologie van Paulus aan.

Binnekort verskyn 'n studie van Wilhelm Wuellner oor *Hermeneutics and Rhetorics* as 'n spesiale uitgawe van *Scriptura*. Dit belooft om 'n interessante publikasie te wees, en kan regstreeks bestel word van *Scriptura*, Departement Bybelkunde, Universiteit van Stellenbosch. EDITORIAL

The focus in this issue is on aspects of New Testament interpretation.

Andries van Aarde discusses the relationship between 'resonance' and 'context' in order to move beyond the confines of a structuralist approach. Johannes Louw looks again at the difference in the time of Jesus' crucifixion according to Mark and to John, and argues that the theory of two chronological systems does not solve the problem. Sam Fourie and Jacques Rousseau offer a detailed analysis of the concept 'unity' in John 13-17, and discuss its meaning for the situation in South Africa. Pieter Craffert interprets the Damascus episode in terms of Berger and Luckmann's model of conversion, and points out the implications of such a move for the interpretation of Galatians 1 and the chronology of Paul.

A monograph by Wilhelm Wuellner entitled *Hermeneutics and Rhetorics* will appear shortly as a special number of *Scriptura*. This promises to be an interesting study, and may be ordered directly from *Scriptura*, Department of Biblical Studies, University of Stellenbosch.
