

*REDAKSIONEEL*

Gesonde menseverhoudinge en die vraagstuk van basiese menseregte is tans, te midde van 'n RGN-onderzoek na Tussengroepverhoudinge, in die brandpunt van belangstelling. 'n Leemte in die huidige debat is dat selde voldoende aandag gegee word aan die mensbeskouing wat ten grondslag van die verskillende opvattings lê. 'n Bybelse mensbeskouing het in hierdie gesprek 'n belangrike bydrae te lewer, en die eerste artikel van professor Suggit behandel sekere aspekte hiervan vanuit 'n Bybels-teologiese gesigshoek.

Die ander twee bydraes is albei sterk onderwysgerig. Die eerste bepleit 'n vars benadering in die aanbied Bybelonderrig op skool, en stel 'n belangrike navorsingsprojek oor die leerplanne vir hierdie vak wat tans deur die Departement Bybelkunde aan die Universiteit van Port Elizabeth onderneem word, aan die orde.

Die laaste artikel gee 'n uitvoerige beskrywing van 'n interessante nuwe benadering tot die religieuse onderrig van kinders. Die metode, wat uitgaan van sekere beginsels van die Montessori-skool, verteenwoordig 'n baanbrekerspoging om belangrike elemente van die spel-konsep bruikbaar te maak vir religieuse onder-

Healthy human relations and the question of basic human rights are focal points of interest at a time when the HSRC is conducting a large-scale investigation into Intergroup Relations. The view of man underlying the various approaches seldom receives sufficient attention. A sound Biblical anthropology has much to contribute in this respect and the first article by Professor Suggit discusses some of these aspects, seen from a Biblical-theological perspective.

The other two contributions deal with educational matters. The first argues in favour of a new approach to the teaching of Scripture in schools, and refers to an important research project being undertaken by the Department of Biblical Studies at the University of Port Elizabeth, concerning syllabuses for this subject.

The third article describes in detail an interesting and novel approach to religious instruction for children. This method, which is based on certain principles of the Montessori school, represents a pioneering effort at utilizing important elements of the concept of play in religious instruction. This approach has been developed experimentally by Dr Berryman at the Child Center in Houston,
